Quinn London is committed to being a sustainable business in leaving a lasting, positive, social, environmental and economic legacy as a result of our actions.

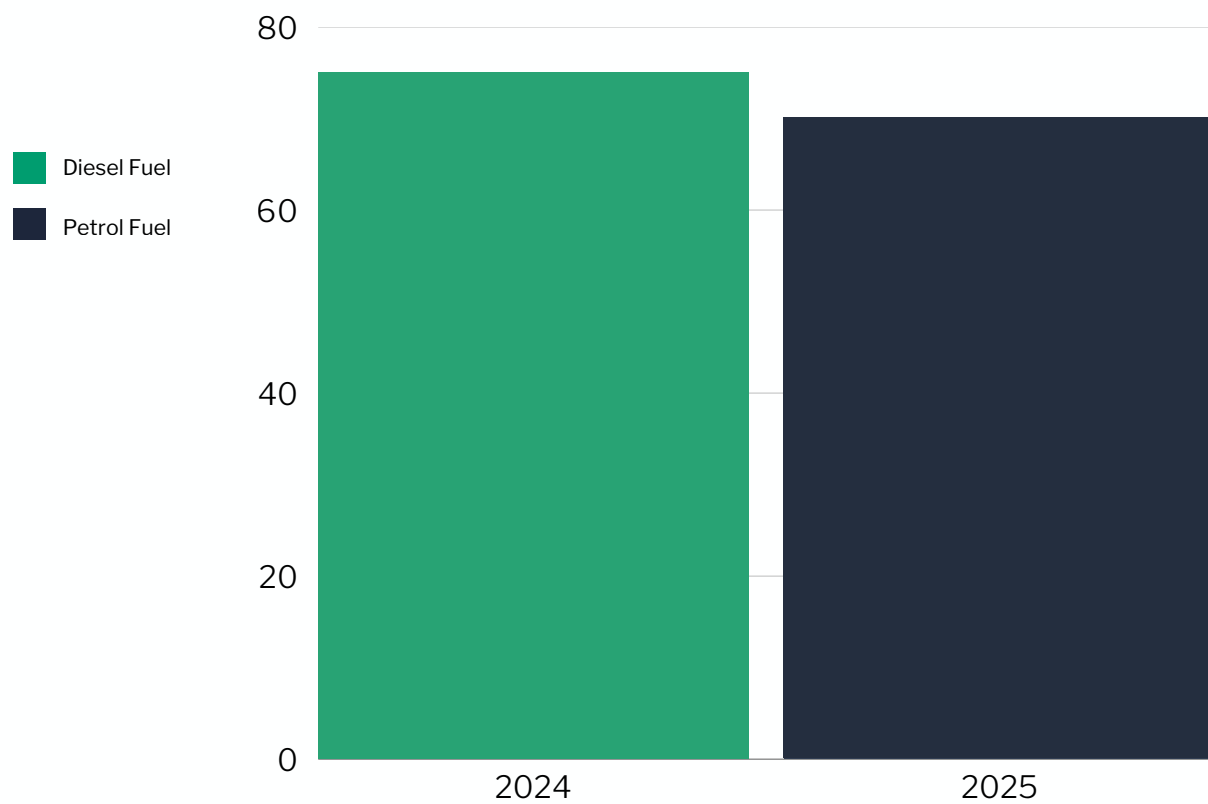
Our approach to sustainability ensures best practice across all of our activities, extending beyond the construction projects we deliver. Through our own business operations and supporting our clients to achieve their sustainability goals.

The UK Government amended the Climate Change Act 2008 in 2019 by introducing a target of at least a 100% reduction in the net UK carbon account (i.e., reduction of greenhouse gas emissions compared to 1990 levels) by 2050.

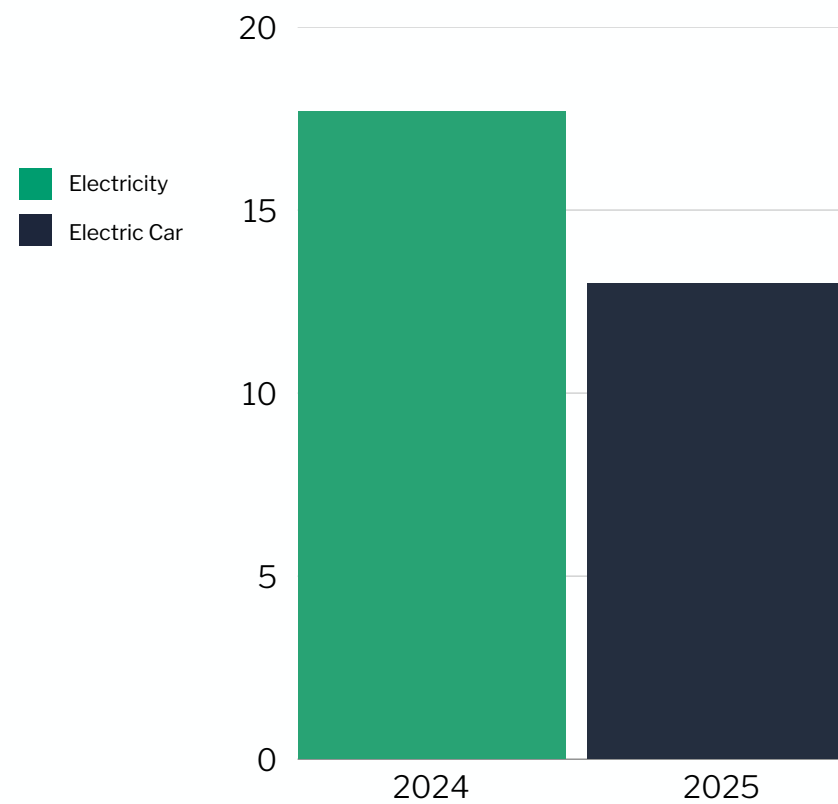

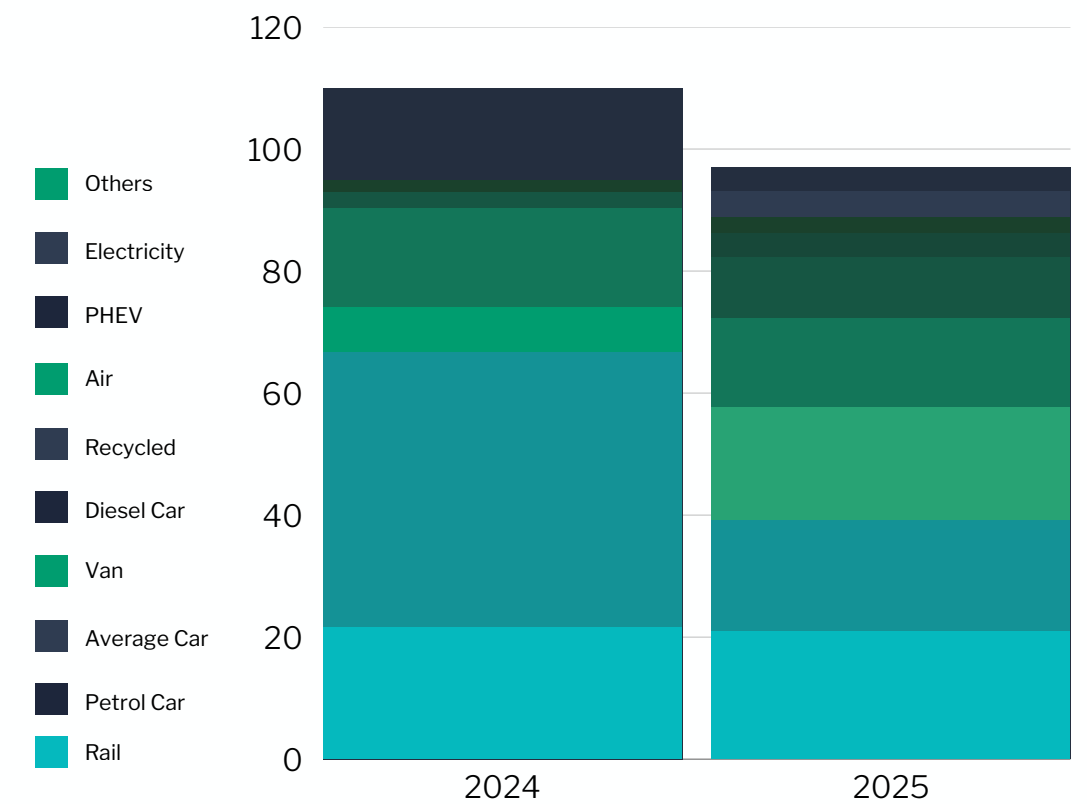
Scope 1, 2, & 3 Emissions Comparison: YE2024 vs. YE2025

from YE24 to YE25

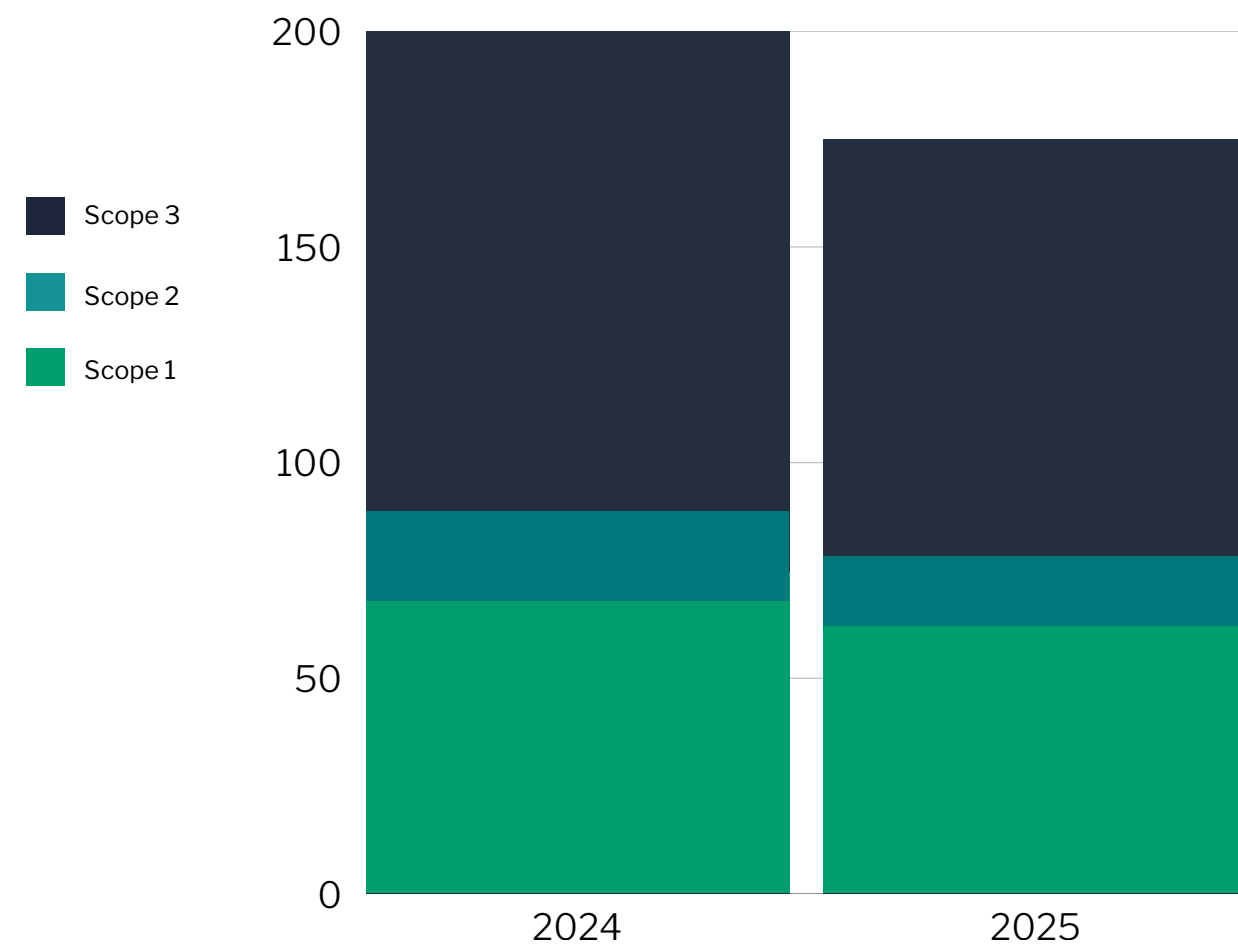


Scope 3 reduced by 14.7%

Planet Mark Report 2025

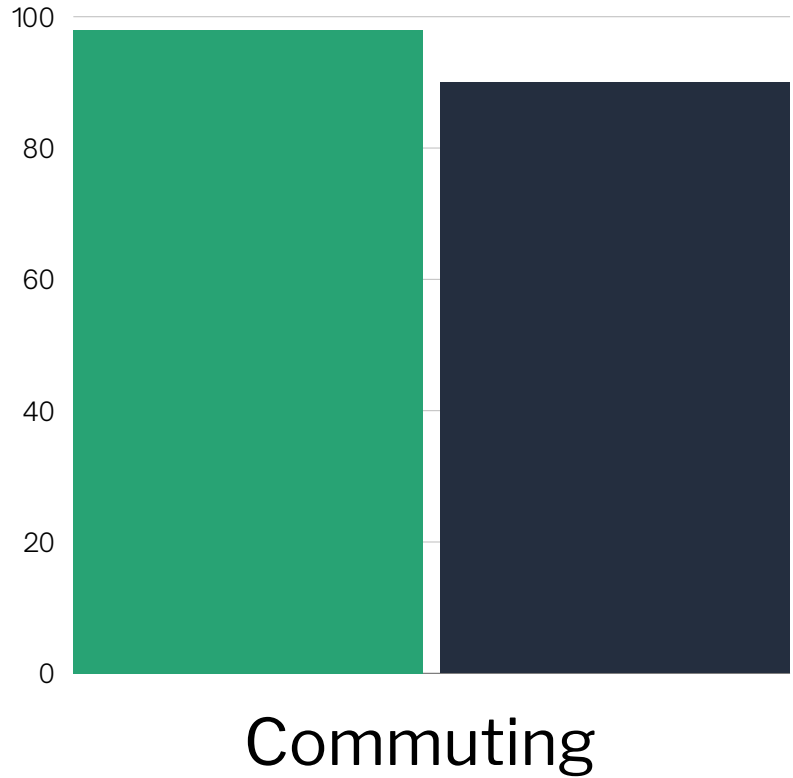
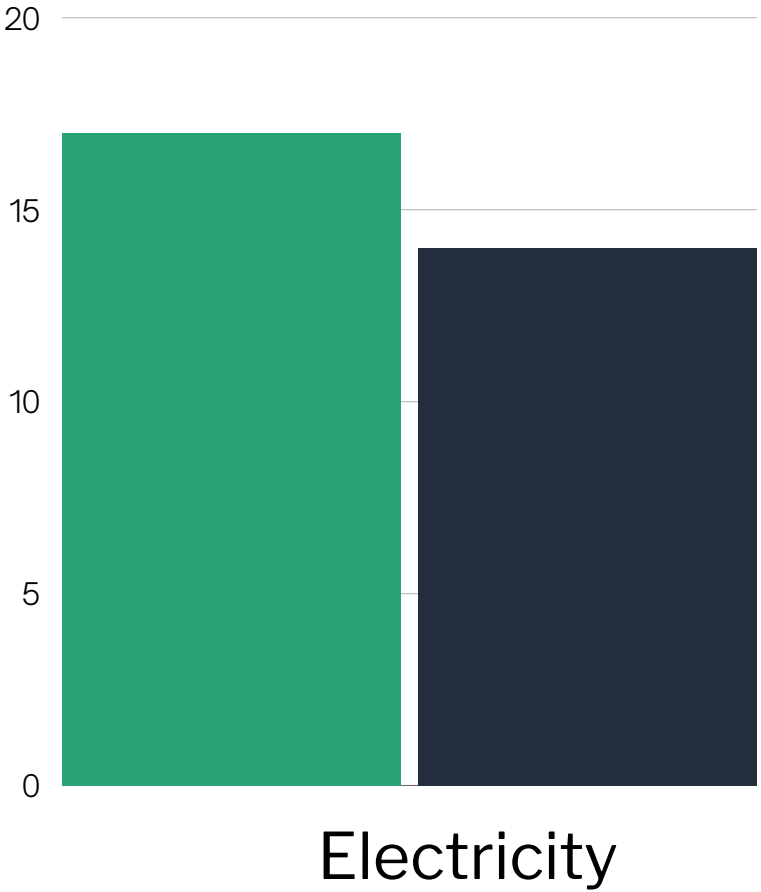
Quinn London Limited has achieved Planet Mark Certified – Business by reporting its measured carbon emissions, reducing Scope 1 and 2 emissions (market-based) by 8.4% compared to the previous reporting Period.

Carbon Reduction Projects

Retrofit Projects

The goal of our Retrofit programme is to significantly **improve building energy performance**. This is achieved through comprehensive upgrade works on existing properties, specifically focusing on enhanced insulation for heat retention and the integration of **renewable energy systems** to replace fossil fuels.

We are currently undertaking major retrofit projects with **Barnet Homes and Peabody**. A highlight of this work is the **Barnet Retrofit project, which earned a shortlisting for Retrofit Project of the Year at the Unlock Net Zero Awards 2025.**

Hospital Projects

Quinn London is undertaking the installation of **Air Source Heat Pumps (ASHPs)** at Hammersmith and Homerton Hospitals. ASHPs offer a highly efficient, sustainable alternative to traditional fossil fuel systems. By generating up to **three times more energy** than they consume, these installations directly contribute to the **reduction of carbon emissions** and support the hospitals in achieving their sustainability goals.

The British Museum

The British Museum is an essential partner in the delivery of the new East Road Building, which is a core component of the wider Energy Centre Programme. This new, sustainable Energy Centre is designed to phase out the Museum's reliance on fossil fuels, significantly improving the efficiency and resilience of its energy infrastructure.

Local Impact, Global Responsibility

Eco Cabins

Quinn is upgrading its site accommodation by deploying **Eco Cabins** that replace standard fuel models and remove reliance on diesel generators. These innovative cabins are **carbon neutral** and emit **zero emissions**, powered entirely by **100% renewable energy**. They feature roof and wall-mounted solar panels that store collected energy in lithium-ion batteries for heating and lighting. Furthermore, the cabins utilize **rain harvesting**, collecting and sterilizing water for on-site handwashing.



Community Volunteering

We invested **805 hours** in community volunteering efforts this year, showcasing our team's dedication to making a local impact. Highlights include **70 staff** participating in the **Cook for Good** project, which provided meals to estate community members. Furthermore, we collaborated with Homerton Hope to deliver several impactful **refurbishment projects** at Homerton University Hospital, directly improving patient care facilities. Beyond volunteering, our direct contributions included donating **440 meals** to school-age children and residents. This initiative was significantly supported by our partnership with the **Homerton Adventure Playground**, where we sponsored summer half-term lunches for local kids.



Community Wood Recycling

We partner with the **Community Wood Recycling** social enterprise to deliver powerful **social and environmental value** simultaneously. This collaboration ensures that all uncontaminated timber waste from our sites is diverted from landfill, significantly boosting our **recycling rates** and lowering our waste disposal costs.

In this reporting period we have sent 87.7 tonnes of wood to Community Wood Recycling





At Quinn London, we recognise that climate change represents a significant challenge, both to the environment and to our long-term business resilience. As such, we commit to reducing our greenhouse gas emissions and moving towards becoming net-zero.


